COURSE SELECTION GUIDELINES:

1. Students must choose 8 courses. Course descriptions can be found on myBlueprint.ca.
2. Choose the appropriate level of study (L, P, D, E, O) for all courses.
3. Students who have failed a compulsory Grade 9 course please prioritize these courses during course selection.
4. Ensure you have the course prerequisites by checking the Course Calendar on myBlueprint.ca
5. Hand in completed course selection form printed from myBlueprint, the Activity fee (\$90), and Student Identification Consent Form on Thursday, February 25th.

- Physical Education, Art and Language courses may have an additional fee to be paid at the start of the course.
- Check the *Mathways Chart* when planning for future math courses.
- **ENRICHED COURSE REQUIREMENTS:**
 - **English** and **History** require a pre-requisite grade of 80% in END1D1 or ENG1DE
 - **Math** requires a pre-requisite grade of 85% in MPM1D1 or MPM1DE
 - **Science** requires a pre-requisite grade of 80% in SNC1D1 or SNC1DE

Diploma Requirements:

What do you need to graduate from high school?

18 compulsory credits

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

4	credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
3	credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
2	credits in science
1	credit in Canadian history
1	credit in Canadian geography
1	credit in the arts
1	credit in health and physical education
1	credit in French as a second language
0.5	credit in career studies
0.5	credit in civics

In addition, students must complete:

✓	12 optional credits [†]
✓	40 hours of community involvement activities
✓	the provincial literacy requirement

* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

** In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

*** A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

† The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.
